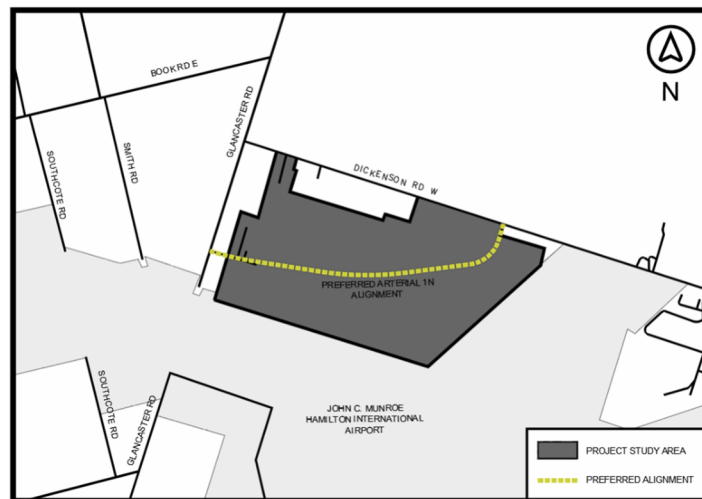
Arterial Roadway 1N – Dickenson Road West to Glancaster Road

Municipal Class Environmental Assessment – Schedule C

Background

Dickenson Limited Partnership initiated a Draft Plan of Subdivision process for a new industrial development adjacent to the John C. Munro International Airport within the City of Hamilton's Airport Employment Growth District Secondary Plan lands. In parallel with the Draft Plan of Subdivision process, Dickenson Limited Partnership (as the proponent) worked with the City of Hamilton (as a key stakeholder) to

complete the Schedule C Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) process for Arterial Roadway 1N, that extends from Dickenson Road West to Glancaster Road, within private development lands. The preferred alignment is shown in the figure.



Environmental Study Report Comment Period Extension

The project followed the Schedule C requirements under the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class EA process (February 2024). An Environmental Study Report (ESR) documenting the planning process undertaken, details of the road alignment and design as well as potential impacts and mitigation measures, was completed and made available for public comment from July 10, 2026 to August 10, 2026. The ESR was initially placed on public record for the 30-day comment period and a decision was made by the proponent to extend the comment period covering the period from **July 10, 2026 to August 31, 2026**. The report is still available for comments online at the project website: cghtransportation.com/planning/Arterial1NEA.

Since this project was part of the Draft Plan of Subdivision for the full development many of the technical studies completed were done to support the full industrial development proposal. Arterial Roadway 1N is within these development lands so the technical studies are applicable however only a specific portion of the studies applies to the roadway. We have posted on the project website some of these applicable technical studies that supported the planning application. When reviewing

these reports it is key to focus on the roadway (which is the Schedule C project) and not the full development.
